- Transition of Niedecker collection to Museum. Amy Lutezke is current president of Friends of Lorine Niedecker and she wrote a letter outlining the Friends of Niedecker's support of and willingness to help the Library Board with the transition of the collection and ownership of the collection to the Museum.
- Museum volunteers or graduate students at UW-Madison's School of Information & Library Studies can potentially help with re-integrating the separate pieces of the collection and creating finding aids.
